

Marin County CTE Center

With your support, a new CTE Center will be created on the campus of Terra Linda High School. The Center will add new courses to the array of CTE classes already held at the school. Students from across Marin will be able to come to one location to attend high school CTE courses that build their skills and offer college credit, industry certifications, and career counseling, leading to high-demand, livable-wage careers.







Why a CTE Center?

Due to the scale and scope of CTE programs, schools are often limited in the number of CTE classes they can offer. Each school offers different CTE courses and many students only have access to classes held at their school sites.

A centralized CTE program **maximizes efficiency** by consolidating staffing and equipment in one location. It also allows students to participate in a CTE class even if their school does not offer one in that industry sector.



A Center for All Students

Class schedules will be designed to ensure **accessibility** for students throughout Marin. Students will attend their home schools during the day and CTE Center classes in the early afternoons, evenings, and weekends. Those who need to work, take care of family members, or choose to participate in extracurricular activities will be able to attend CTE Center classes around those responsibilities.

Additional support will be provided to alleviate barriers to participation and successful completion of CTE classes.

Recruitment and program development will be equity-focused to support a diverse student population.

Program Needs

Capital Expenditures

- An all-weather, multi-use, outdoor classroom space to support new CTE classes in the Building Trades
- Renovations of existing classrooms and upgrades in furniture and technology to create flexible work areas



Staffing and Equipment Expenditures

- Instructional and administrative costs for new CTE classes*
- Equipment and materials
- Marketing, outreach, and community engagement for CTE Center classes and activities
- Industry and postsecondary collaboration events and activities
- Career and postsecondary counseling support for students
- Transportation support to ensure access for all students
